

SCHOLARSHIPS

Only talent and potential should determine a student's future. However, the costs of living and studying in London are rising exponentially, putting students from low-income backgrounds at an unfair disadvantage. To help bridge that gap, we awarded £265,000 in scholarships to students thanks to the generosity of our supporters.

Case Study: Scott Slocombe

Scott graduated from BA Performance – Actor Musicianship in November 2024 and was supported by scholarships throughout his training. We're delighted to report Scott has secured agent representation and is now playing Scrooge in the West End in Schools production of *Scroogical*.

"The scholarship was very important in allowing me to focus on my training without constantly worrying about how I'm going to pay my fees. Without the funding I've received for each of my 3 years, I would almost certainly not have been able to afford to complete the course. The whole experience at Mountview has been fantastic, I was always interested in both acting and music independently. I wasn't even aware of actor-musicianship courses until starting the Foundation in Acting at Mountview. My plans after graduation are to work as often as I can in as many interesting and challenging projects as possible. No stage is too small or too big."

THE JUDI DENCH FUND FOR ACCESS TO DRAMA TRAINING

Adapting to Mountview's intensive training can be a big adjustment. Sometimes students need a helping hand - especially when life throws additional obstacles in their way.

The Judi Dench Fund helps by connecting them to mental health and wellbeing support, arranging bespoke learning plans and reasonable adjustments, and offering emergency grants to cover unexpected costs.

Mental Health and Wellbeing

160 students received Mental Health & Wellbeing Support this year, coordinated by Amy Barber, Student Welfare Manager. By meeting with students in confidential, one-to-one settings, Amy has understood their needs and provided tailored approaches including free counselling, therapeutic support and diagnoses for hidden disabilities and aspects of neurodiversity. By putting learning plans and adjustments in place, Amy helps students to focus on their training.

Emergency Grants

The Judi Dench Fund supported **28 students** through emergency grants, with an average award of £507. They were awarded to help students with costs including:

- Rent
- Living costs
- · Medical appointments required for training
- Professional costs (headshots, subscriptions)

Case Study: Jewelle Hutchinson

The Judi Dench Fund supported Jewelle during her studies, ensuring she graduated in 2023. She has since performed at Chichester Festival Theatre and received a nomination from the UK Pantomime Awards 2024.

"If you're at drama school, you might be able to cover your rent, but if you're not eating well, you're working all hours of the night and you can't get to class in the morning, it doesn't make sense. The support offered through the Judi Dench Fund is exactly what we need to level the playing field."

PARTICIPATION

The arts play a vital role in community cohesion and wellbeing. Mountview is dedicated to working with and for the people of Peckham and Southwark, and with your support, we engage residents through:

Generation Next

Every Saturday during school term, children and young people from across Southwark attend regular workshops in acting, dance, musical theatre and more. This year, we received 674 enrolments and 98% of participants reported improved performance and fusion skills.

Our Southwark Bursary Scheme supported 67% to attend, with 94% of bursary recipients attending sessions completely free. Classes were representative of Southwark's diversity too: 67% of registrants were from Black & Global Majority backgrounds, and bursaries reached residents in 19 of Southwark's 23 wards.

Peckham Sessions

Following a successful pilot in 2023, Peckham Sessions returned in spring 2024. Over six weeks, local artists and residents aged 4 to 84 explored acting, dance, singing, zine-making, stop-motion animation and much, much more. On the final weekend, they shared their creations at Open House – a free, full day public takeover of Mountview's studios and theatres:

- 109 participants took part in free weekly workshops and presented their work to 744 people. 42% of participants lived in Peckham, 67% were Black / Global Majority, and 15% D/deaf, disabled or neurodivergent
- 95% of participants felt more connected, 89% benefitted from improved health & wellbeing, and 77% improved skills in their chosen art form

THE ANDRÉ PTASZYNSKI MEMORIAL FUND

In 2021 the André Ptaszynski Memorial Fund was established by friends, family and colleagues to celebrate the life and legacy of one of the industry's best-loved producers. In 23/24, the fund supported:

- The Judi Dench Fund for Access to Drama Training, an initiative André helped launch
- The André Ptaszynski Prize for Producing, awarded to a graduating MA Creative Producing student
- The Ptaszynski Producer, a year-long full-time role supporting early-career producers from diverse backgrounds

This year's Ptaszynski Producer was **Toyin Omari-Kinch**, a London-based Actor and Producer from Birmingham. Toyin gained a wealth of new experiences and skills by:

- Supporting student productions in our two theatres
- Acting as first point of call for external directors working at Mountview on student productions
- Launching new projects including a Puppetry Masterclasses partnership between Mountview & Fuel
- Acting as Series Producer for BA Acting students' short films, supporting MA Creative Producing students' projects and facilitating screenings at Peckhamplex

MOUNTVIEW EXAMS

Launched in 2024, Mountview Exams (MX) is bringing a new Musical Theatre offer to the 1.1m young people taking graded arts examinations in the UK today. MX bears Mountview's hallmarks of innovation and access, with solo exams distinguished by:

- No prescribed repertoire lists any material (including self-written material) is eligible
- Exams are conducted with other performers present creating an authentic audience environment
- Performers have total creative agency of their work
- Examiners are all professionally trained in Musical Theatre, with the first cohort of examiners all Mountview alumni

We're excited to have run our first live examinations in the autumn, receiving fantastic feedback from performers:

We will shortly be launching new syllabi for group examinations. Watch this space!
